What is GMAT?


A standardized test, the Graduate Management Admissions Test measures the Verbal, Mathematical and Analytical skills. The test primarily intends to aid graduate schools of business assess the potential of the applicants for advanced study in business and management. Nearly 1000 management institutes all over the world require GMAT scores from the applicants.

The GMAT is different from most other customary examinations. The examination is entirely computer-based, and no two students get identical sets of questions. Also, students cannot skip questions. The test is scored on a maximum of 800. The GMAT® Score alone cannot guarantee admission into a school. The test is only one of the major factors taken into consideration in the long process of an applicant getting admitted into a Business School he/she desires.

Who conducts GMAT

The GMAT is developed and administered by Pearson VUE under the direction of the Graduate Management Admission Council (GMAC), a non-profit organization of graduate business schools worldwide. For the conduct of the test, Pearson VUE has appointed testing centers in various countries.

The GMAT has four sections – Verbal, Quantitative and Analytical Writing Assessment. The following is the GMAT test structure.



Structure/Pattern of GMAT

The GMAT consists of four separately timed sections. Each of the first two sections consists of an

analytical writing task (please visit the New Generation GMAT section for update on this GMAT section) while the remaining two sections (Quantitative and Verbal) consist of multiple-choice questions delivered in a computer-adaptive format. Questions in these sections are dynamically selected as you take the test from a large pool of potential questions ranging from a low to high level of difficulty. Each of these two sections starts with a question of moderate difficulty. If you answer the first question correctly, the computer will usually give you a harder question. If you answer the first question incorrectly, your next question will be easier. This process will continue until you complete the section, at which point the computer will have an accurate assessment of your ability level in that subject area.

What is the IR section?

The Integrated Reasoning (IR) section will be a part of the GMAT from June 05, 2012. The IR section will:

- Replace the AWA issue task
- Consist of 12 questions (some with sub parts), to be done over 30 minutes
- Not be adaptive
- Be scored separately

The IR section will test your ability to read, understand, and interpret the information presented to you. The information will be provided in different formats (or a combination of different formats, such as text, tables, and graphs). It will test basic data interpretation based on mathematical/ verbal concepts, and you will have access to a calculator during the IR section.

What is the role of IR section section score in university admissions process?

GMAC changed the GMAT exam and added the IR section at the request of the admissions committees of numerous B schools. So, obviously, B schools will give importance to the IR section score. However, it is difficult to guess exactly how much importance is given to sectional scores of GMAT since B schools do not release that data in the public domain.

- AWA section grades are from 0-6 in 0.5 increments.
- IR section is scored on a scale of 1-8 in 1 point increment.
- Quantitative score from 0 to 60 (known as scaled score). However, 51 is 98 percentile.
- Verbal score from 0 to 60 (scaled score). However, above 45 is 99 percentile on verbal.

Total Score from 200-800 in 10 point increments.

Eligibility for GMAT

There are no age or qualification based constraints to take the GMAT – basically anyone can take this test. The GMAT test scores are valid for five years, however while applying to B-Schools it is always better if your scores

• have been obtained within the last 2 years.

Best time to take GMAT

GMAT appointments are available all round the year. You can choose your own date and time for taking the GMAT though we recommend you tto take the test well in advance to your MBA application date as it give s you an opportunity to retake the test in case the score is not upto your expectation . The test is administered in select cities (refer table below) five-days-a-week (Monday through Friday) and two times a day. During peak season (Sep to Dec) you need to register at least 90 days in advance to get a date of your choice, while at other times registering at least 15 days in advance would be advisable. The GMAT lasts roughly four hours, and most centres offer two slots: 9 A.M. and 2 P.M.
